

From the streets of her South Bronx childhood to the broadcast studios of present-day Manhattan and on ZOOM for her current broadcasts Denise Richardson has covered a dizzying array of ground during her illustrious career. veryone has a superpower. For Denise Richardson it's an uncanny ability to connect with anyone—especially with everyone in a room to care about almost any person or issue. It's no wonder she has co-hosted The Pledge Drive on PBS for more than twenty years. Formerly a Good Morning America correspondent, she was also a lifestyle and news reporter for Fox 5's Good Day New York, fund-raising emcee/auctioneer and Sopranos guest star, —these are just a few of her other notable titles.

Denise, a woman of faith, brings a singular mission to everything she does: to connect people from every walk of life through mutual empowerment, empathy, and understanding. She believes that we all have more in common than not and that our strength lies in the power of each one of us to make a difference in the lives of others.

To that end she developed her inspirational and motivational radio program, Fuel for the Spirit, which aired on AM 570 and 102.3FM The Mission WMCA for more than two years. Fuel for the Spirit will soon be heard and enjoyed on her upcoming podcast. She also created and hosted Beyond the Bells, a Salvation Army Greater New York Division related program which aired on WOR (710)AM while serving as Director of Communications for the organization.

A "Pitch Person for Good," Denise's demeanor may be gentle, but her fund-raising prowess is ferocious having helped to raise millions of dollars co-hosting **The Pledge Drive** on PBS to keep its quality programming coming into homes nationwide. She hosted the IONA College of New Rochelle, NY's Gala after its return from COVID-19 limitations raising a million dollars. Denise also emceed a virtual auction for Broadway Housing Communities which provides deeply affordable housing, early childhood education and access to the Arts through the Sugar Hill Children's Museum in Harlem and Washington Heights. She helped to raise \$200,000.

Denise Richardson's outreach extends way beyond broadcasting. She taught elementary school in the South Bronx neighborhood where she grew up and she developed a career workshop for female inmates at the Bayview Correctional facility in New York City. In addition, she was responsible for Affirmative Action programs for a Fortune 500 corporation.

Denise graduated with a B.A. in Sociology from Hunter College and now is a proud member of the Hunter College Hall of Fame.

Denise knows a little something about facing her fears. She skydived 3800 feet over Long Island and bungee jumped 23 stories off of Skipper's Canyon Bridge in New Zealand. It's experiences like these that have helped to keep Denise Richardson grounded.

2021 President's Award

Kenya V. Beard, EdD, AGACNP-BC, CNE, ANEF, FAAN, is the Associate Provost for Social Mission and Academic Excellence at Chamberlain University, the largest nursing school in the U.S. As a 2012 Macy Faculty Scholar, she focused on increasing workforce diversity and strengthening educational and health care equity. In her former role as Senior Fellow at the Center for Health Policy and Media Engagement at George Washington University School of Nursing, she wrote blogs and co-produced health care disparity segments for HealthCetera, on WBAI-FM for an audience of over 400,000 diverse listeners.

Dr. Beard has consulted with numerous schools across the country on ways to strengthen workforce diversity. She led the New York State Action Coalition in constructing the state's 2014 Workforce Diversity

Toolkit and contributed to the National League for Nursing's 2016 Diversity Vision Statement. She co-created the Josiah Macy Foundation's 2018 ground-breaking document, Improving the Environment for Learning in the Health Professions and more recently, co-authored the publication, Racism and the Diversity Policy Paradox: Implications for Nurse Leaders to help combat racism in higher education. Many of her publications amplify the importance of graduating a diverse workforce that is prepared to improve health care access and quality. Her workshop, Leading in a Race-Conscious Society, is supported by the Harvard Macy Institute's Program for Educators in the Health Professions.

She was honored to serve as a reviewer for the National Academy of Medicine's Future of Nursing 2020-2030 report and recently joined the National League for Nursing's Taking Aim initiative to address racism in nursing. She provided the NLN's inaugural webinar, Leading Conversations that Center on Racism.

Dr. Beard is a fellow of the New York Academy of Medicine, American Academy of Nursing, and Academy of Nursing Education. She serves as an advisor for the New York Academy of Medicine's National Health Equity Scholars Network and was recently appointed to the American Nurses Association's National Commission to Address Racism in Nursing. She is Chair of the American Academy of Nursing's Diversity and Inclusivity Committee and serves as a Board Member at Large for the New York State Board for Nursing. She also serves as an editorial board member for the American Journal of Nursing.

Trailblazer Award



Torian Easterling, MD, MPH serves as the First Deputy Commissioner and Chief Equity Officer at the NYC Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (NYCDOHMH).

Dr. Easterling has spent more than 6 years in a senior leadership role at the Health Department. Prior to serving as First Deputy Commissioner and Chief Equity Officer, Dr. Easterling served as Deputy Commissioner of the Center for Health Equity and Community Wellness at the NYC DOHMH, where he oversaw programmatic work focused on reducing overall premature mortality and closing the racial gap on the top leading causes of preventable death.

He also served as the Assistant Commissioner of the Department of Health's Bureau of Brooklyn Neighborhood Health, where he helped advance key

programming to address pressing concerns, including maternal deaths and gun violence. Dr. Easterling is a community physician committed to health equity, social justice and movement building to achieve the health outcomes that all people deserve both locally and globally.

Dr. Easterling holds a Bachelor of Science from Morehouse College (Atlanta, GA), a Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) from Rutgers-New Jersey Medical School, and a Master of Public Health (M.P.H) from Icahn School of Medicine at Sinai in New York. He completed his residency in Family Medicine at Jamaica Hospital Medical Center in Queens, NY, and a General Preventive Medicine residency at Icahn School of Medicine at Sinai in New York.

Barbara Felker, MS, MDiv is Vice President, Strategic Community Partnerships, Community & Population Health Northwell Health. Her progressive leadership positions at Northwell began in Human Resources (Labor Relations and Talent Management), and Diversity &Inclusion. As Vice President of D&I, she was instrumental in the development of the D&I workforce strategy and the Supplier Diversity strategic plan. As a result, Northwell received the Diversity Inc. Top 10 Health and Hospital Recognition for the implementation of the Business Employee Resource Groups, and the VALOR Veterans program.

Rev. Felker has more than 15 years experience in diverse industries that include talent management, diversity, inclusion & health equity, labor relations, state legislation and consulting. She served as the Legislative Director for

the New York State Senate upon completion of her fellowship with the Center for Women in Government & Civil Society at the Rockefeller College of Public Affairs and Policy. Her career trajectory includes progressive leadership positions at New York Presbyterian's Morgan Stanley Children's Hospital, The Brooklyn Hospital Center and HR Dynamics Consulting.

Leveraging her experience in the New York State Senate, Rev Felker serves as co-lead of Northwell's Faith Based Covid-19 Testing and Vaccine Initiatives in collaboration with the NYS Governor and the NYS Department of Health. In addition, she served as a "True North" consultant for the Brooklyn Study initiative to redesign healthcare in Central Brooklyn, NY, expanding Northwell's footprint into the Brooklyn market. Success in both collaborative initiatives between Northwell Heath, the Governor and the NYS Department of Health is contingent upon key legislative, community and faith-based relationships developed and sustained throughout her career.

Rev. Felker obtained a Master of Science in Health Services Administration from The New School's Milano Graduate School of Management and Urban Policy and a Master of Divinity from New Brunswick Theological Seminary. As an ordained Minister, she serves as Pastor of Leadership Development at the Highbridge Community Church, Bronx, NY.

Rev. Felker obtained the Certificate in Clinical Bio-Ethics from the Hofstra University Bioethics Center, to provide a diverse perspective to ethics consultations and also serves as a member of the Admissions Committee for the Hofstra-Northwell Graduate School of Nursing. She is a certified leadership coach and a former faculty member of Northwell's Center for Learning and Innovation (CLI). Her impact as a consultant and coach is maximized on her ability to develop strong relationships and serve as a catalyst for change

Gil Addo, MBA is CEO and Co-founder of RubiconMD, a digital health platform that allows primary care clinicians to access same-day opinions, or eConsults, from top medical specialists to improve patient care.

Founded in 2013, RubiconMD serves primary care clinicians across 37 states. The company has raised over \$40 million in funding from top tier venture capital firms. In 2015, The Huffington Post named RubiconMD one of the "Five Companies Defining the Future of Healthcare." Prior to founding RubiconMD, Gil was a Consultant at Putnam Associates, a pharma strategy consultancy, where he designed payer and market access strategies for fortune 500 clients. He previously held strategy and business

development roles at Xerox, Cubist (acquired by Merck), and two early stage healthcare ventures.

Gil has appeared in Inc, Forbes, CNBC, Fortune and Entrepreneur Magazine. He's been named one of Forbes' "30 Under 30" in healthcare, Crain's New York Business 40 Under 40 and Business Insider's 30 under 40 in healthcare. In 2020, Crain's New York named Gil to its list of the Most Notable in Health Care and in 2017 he received their Heritage Healthcare Innovator of the Year award. He holds a BS in Economics and Biomedical Engineering from Yale and an MBA from Harvard.

Stacie Williams. SPHR. Vice President of Human Resources, NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital/Columbia University Medical Center, has over twenty-nine years of experience in Human Resources. In her current role, she is responsible for guiding overall HR strategy for the Columbia campus as well as the development and implementation of labor strategies for the system. Stacie began her career at New York-Presbyterian in 2002 as a Human Resources Manager. She was promoted in 2006 to the Director of Labor/Employee Relations at NYP/Columbia and served as the Interim Vice President. Human Resources, NYP/Weill Cornell in 2011 during a 9-month transition period. Prior to joining NYP's team, Stacie worked for over 10 years at Montefiore Medical Center, serving in various HR roles including positions in labor & employee relations, recruitment, and benefits.

Stacie holds a Bachelor of Science degree, magna cum laude, in Health Services Administration from Lehman College of The City University of New York, as well as a Master of Science in Human Resources, with a focus on Industrial and Labor Relations from Baruch College of the City University of New York. She also earned her designations as Senior Professional in Human Resources (SPHR) from the Society of Human Resources Management since 1995, Human Capital Strategist (HCS) from the Human Capital Institute in 2012, Senior Certified Professional (SHRM-SCP) from the Society of Human Resources Management in 2015 and obtained a certification in Diversity and Inclusion from Cornell University in 2018. Percy Allen, II Leadership Award



Wayne J. Riley, M.D., MPH, MBA, MACP, was appointed by the Board of Trustees of The State University of New York (SUNY) as the 17th President of SUNY Downstate Health Sciences University in January of 2017. Downstate is one of four academic health centers in the 64 campus SUNY System and the only one in New York City.

Dr. Riley is an academic primary care general internist with more than 25 years of progressively senior executive level management, policy, and leadership experience in academic medicine, patient care, research administration, academic health center administration, healthcare management, health policy, biotechnology, the corporate sector, government service, advocacy, and organized medicine. Before Dr.

Riley's appointment at Downstate, he served as clinical professor of Medicine and adjunct professor of Health Policy at the Vanderbilt University School of Medicine and as an adjunct professor of Management at Vanderbilt's Owen Graduate School of Management. Before his role at Vanderbilt, from 2007-2013, Dr. Riley served with distinction as the 10th president, chief executive officer, and professor of Medicine at Meharry Medical College.

Dr. Riley earned his Doctor of Medicine degree from the Morehouse School of Medicine, a Bachelor of Arts degree in anthropology with a concentration in medical anthropology from Yale University, and a Master of Public Health degree in health systems management from the Tulane University School of Public Health and Tropical Medicine. He also earned a Master of Business Administration from Rice University's Jesse H. Jones Graduate School of Business. In addition, Dr. Riley completed residency training in internal medicine at the Baylor College of Medicine, rising from instructor of medicine to vice president and vice dean for Health Affairs and Governmental Relations. At Baylor, he also held the academic rank of associate professor of Internal Medicine.

In June of 2021—alongside Drs. Anthony Fauci and Eric Topol—Dr. Riley was awarded the *National Medical Humanism Medal* by the Arnold P. Gold Foundation for his impactful leadership during the pandemic and passionate advocacy towards addressing health disparities and anti-racism in medicine and healthcare. In 2019, he received the National Medical Fellowships, Inc. *Champion of Health Award* for his exemplary career in medicine and the support of minority medical students.

Dr. Riley was elected in 2020 as Chair of the Board of Trustees of the New York Academy of Medicine (NYAM), whose mission is to influence and encourage action towards improving the health of all New Yorkers by addressing health inequity in the areas of healthy aging, disease prevention, and the elimination of health disparities. Dr. Riley is the first Black board chair in the organization's 173-year history.

Also, in 2020, Dr. Riley began a three-year term as a Commissioner of the U.S. Medicare Payment Advisory Commission (MedPAC), a non-partisan federal agency that advises Congress on Medicare payments to physicians and healthcare facilities. He is also President Emeritus, Former Regent, and a Master of the American College of Physicians (ACP)—the nation's largest medical specialty organization representing internal medicine and its subspecialties. In addition, Dr. Riley is an elected member of the prestigious National Academy of Medicine (NAM) of the National Academy of Sciences, where he previously served as Vice-Chair and later, as Chair of NAM's Section on the Administration of Health Services, Education, and Research.

Dr. Riley is currently President of the Society of Medical Administrators, an organization of 50 of the nation's leading physician executives, a member of the American Clinical and Climatological Association, a member of the Sullivan Alliance to Diversify the Health Professions, Treasurer, and member of the Board of Directors of the Coalition of Urban Serving Universities. He is the Secretary of the Board of Directors of the Arnold P. Gold Foundation.

In 2019, Dr. Riley was appointed Co-Chair of the SUNY Student Mental Health Task Force. The task force developed recommendations to address students' mental health and well-being needs throughout the SUNY System.


Dr. Riley has received numerous awards and honors that include the Alpha Omega Alpha Honor Medical Society, the Arnold P. Gold Medical Humanism Honor Society, the Delta Omega Public Health Honor Society, and the SUNY Downstate *Ailanthous Award* for Outstanding Public Health Leadership. He has also received three honorary degrees from SUNY Downstate Health Sciences University, Tuskegee University, and Mount St. Joseph University.

Dr. Riley is an experienced corporate director who currently serves on the Boards of HCA Healthcare, Inc. and Compass Pathways, PLC.

A native of New Orleans and now a Brooklyn resident, Dr. Riley is an active community leader. He serves on the Boards of Directors of the Bedford-Stuyvesant Restoration Corporation, the YMCA of Greater New York, Catholic Charities Brooklyn & Queens, and the Arthur Ashe Institute for Urban Health.
