## May 2020

May 1st, 2020: HEALTH & COMMUNITY SERVICE EVENT: Although we are social distancing NYR NAHSE participated in a virtual event hosted by Fordham University Collegiate Science and Technology Entry Program (CSTEP). This event, Conversations in Public Health and Hospital Administration was organized by Okechukwu Ogbutor, MPH, MSDS, Health and Community Service Committee Chair.

CSTEP's focus is to increase the number of students from underrepresented groups who are pursuing professional licensure and careers in mathematics, science, technology and health-related fields. This event was geared towards undergraduate students interested in Public Health. Over 45 participants from New York CSTEP programs were in attendance.

Panelists included NYR NAHSE Members: **Shana L. Dacon, MPH, MBA**; **Stephen E. Grayson, MA**; **Carle-Marie Memnon, DHA, MBA, MA, FACHE**, President; **Okechukwu Ogbutor, MPH, MSDS**, Health and Community Service Committee Chair, and **Maija Williams, MPH**, Parliamentarian and Bylaws Committee Chair. Students had the opportunity to hear about NAHSE, panelists career path and pearls of wisdom about seeking public health care careers especially during the covid-19 pandemic.





May 19th, 2020: NYR hosted a virtual meeting on "Maternal & Infant Health: Understanding Equity," featuring *Dr. Martine Hackett*, Associate Professor and Master of Public Health Program Director, Hofstra University as well as Founder of Birth Justice Warriors. Her research interests include maternal-child health, health equity, suburban public health and community-based research. *Dr. Danielle Laraque-Arena*, Senior Scholar-in-Residence, New York Academy of Medicine, Adjunct Professor of Epidemiology at the School of Public Health, Columbia University. Speakers were able to present on their expertise with panel questions and participant questions to follow. Program was moderated by Raven Brewington, MHA, NYR NAHSE Public Policy Chair and Northeast Public Policy and Advocacy Representative.

Participants were engaged in discussion on a number of relevant topics impacting Maternal and Infant Health. As updated data continues to prove the danger COVID-19 is for people with underlying health conditions, Dr. Laraque-Arena went in depth on precautions that pregnant people should take in these uncertain times. The drastic increase in the utilization of telemedicine during the coronavirus pandemic is a turning point for all health systems. Delivery of care and access to reproductive and maternal healthcare are being challenged. Panelist stressed the importance of understanding policies impacting our community and our health was highlighted a number of times by both Dr. Hackett and Dr. Laraque-Arena as they both continue advocate for Maternal and Infant Health. Access issues from uninsured rates to expanding Medicaid were discussed.

Participants were able to learn about S. 3424 - Black Maternal Health Momnibus Act of 2020 - to end preventable maternal mortality and severe maternal morbidity in the United States and close disparities in maternal health outcomes. Closing points touched on strategic legislation and advocacy groups who understand the inequity that communities experience are crucial to making improvements in rates of Maternal and Infant Mortality in America



Panelists provided actionable next steps, i.e. ensuring pay equity, having a diverse board and executive team, managing microagressions and supporiting Medicaid expansion.



Nov. 3, 2020	Last day to postmark ballot. Must be received by the local
	board of elections no later than Nov. 10th.
Nov. 3, 2020	Last day to deliver ballot IN-PERSON to the local board of elections (by someone other than the voter).
