Participants heard from our esteemed panelists from the U.S. Census Bureau, Kendall Johnson, Executive Director and Regional Experts Lisa Moore, Assistant Regional Census Manger, NY Region and Ellisa Johnson, Chicago Regional Director, U.S. Census Bureau. *Census Deadline has been extended*.

The Census happens every 10 years to count people of all ages. Data is used to help determine the allocation of \$675 billion federal funds each year. It helps support education, housing, health programs and much more.

NEW YORK 2020 VOTER REGISTRATION TIMELINE



The first-ever National Black Voter Day will be held on September 18, 2020 to aid Black citizens against suppression tactics and ensure that their vote counts in the various elections taking place in November. In the height of racial injustices, concerns about voter suppression is at an all-time high including fewer poll workers and machines and racial discrimination when voting or participate in politics.
